Notes

- 1) No organ music during Advent
- 2) Although Immaculata always falls before the third Sunday of Advent, Tournemire begins his cycle on this Sunday. This may be to emphasise the Christocentric nature of the liturgy, and therefore of his work.
- 3) As a Sunday of the second class, the second Sunday of Advent gives way to the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary (duplex I class).
- 4) Depending on the date of Easter, there are two, three, four or five Sundays after Epiphany before the Easter cycle begins with Septuagesima Sunday. Sundays four and five do not have their own chorale propers, instead repeating the chants from the third Sunday after Epiphany.
- 5) No organ music during Lent
- 6) No organ music during Holy Week
- 7) The **Sollemnitas Sancti Joseph, Sponsi B.M.V., Confessoris, Ecclesiae universalis Patroni** ("Adjutor et protector") was moved by Pius X in 1913 to the Wednesday after the second Sunday after Easter. In some dioceses, the "external celebration" of the feast took place on the following third Sunday after Easter, which is then omitted. This is the situation on which Tournemire bases his calculations.

This feast day was abolished in 1956 by Pius XII in favor of the newly created **Sollemnitas S. Joseph, Opificis sponsi B.M.V., Confessori** on May 1 ("Sapientia reddidit").

Both feasts are not to be confused with the classic St. Joseph's Day (**S. Joseph, Sponsi B.M.V.**) on March 19 ("Justus ut palma florebit").
- 8) Tournemire did not set this Sunday to music. Probably because Corpus Christi was moved to the following Sunday.
- 9) Contrary to his original plan, Tournemire did not set this Sunday to music either.
- 10) A new liturgical form was given to the feast in 1956 („Signum Magnum"). Tournemire composed music for the older Officium („Gaudeamus omnes").
- 12) As the Nativity of Mary is always celebrated on 8 September, but the Sundays after Pentecost vary with the date of Easter, the order of the days changes each year.
- 12) The chants for the 24th and last Sunday after Pentecost are the same as those for the 23rd Sunday after Pentecost.
